### ABOUT RAINIER PREP:

Rainier Prep is a rigorous college preparatory 5th – 8th public charter school located on the border of South Seattle and Burien, WA. We believe in the inherent capacity of every student to succeed in a college prep environment. Rainier Prep aims to achieve radically different outcomes for students who are traditionally underrepresented on college campuses and in leadership positions. We are focused on identifying and serving those students who will be the first in their families to attend and graduate from college, and we strive to prepare all students to excel at four-year colleges and to serve as leaders in their communities. ### **POSITION SUMMARY:**

Rainier Prep is seeking talented educators who love teaching and who know how to balance rigor and curiosity in a classroom setting. This role will lead an advisory, teach a reading class, co-teach academic classes, teach two afternoon enrichment classes (2 days per week), a lunch or recess duty, and be a critical member of the Rainier Prep community.

## MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

At Rainier Prep, we believe that teachers are the cornerstone of creating an exceptional school. Our teachers create a classroom culture of high expectations, learning, curiosity, hard work and support for each student. Hires are expected to work from 8:00am-4:00pm daily and/or per the schedule set at time of hire.

## Establish Strong School and Classroom Culture:

- Cultivate a healthy classroom and school culture, modeling an approach to learning which emphasizes risk-taking, respect, curiosity and constant commitment to quality improvement
- Establish/encourage culture of flexible and collaborative collegiality in which mission and goals of the school are the foremost focus of all decision making; lead students to handle adversity and ambiguity well
- Thrive in an innovative, reflective culture that demands flexibility and quick adjustments to meet student needs

- Teach high-quality small group lessons
- Keep detailed progress on students with IEPs or students within the MTSS process as well as coordinate services for students receiving special education services
- Co-plan units of study and daily lessons with clear outcomes that students can understand
- Plan with the end in mind using UBD (Understanding by Design) principles
- Daily use of formative assessment to guide instruction
- Seek additional knowledge about how to diagnose students' misconceptions and correct quickly

- Experience working with diverse students/families and an advocate for all children

Annual salary is dependent on experience and starts at \$59,080 for certificated teaching positions. Eligibility for benefits such as retirement, health, dental and vision insurance, etc. are specific to each hired position's schedule at time of hire.

Lead Learning Specialist Responsibilities:

- Manage, coordinate, and support related service providers (SLP, OT, School Psych) to ensure IEP minutes are being met and schedules are coordinated (including communication about school holidays, testing days, etc).
- Collaborate with operations and teachers to schedule special education students based on needs, service minute requirements and SDI requirements.
- Coordinate and ensure delivery of SDI (either through other special education teacher or general education teachers/associate teachers).
- Carry caseload of majority of students in school inlcuding developing, updating IEPs, reevaluations.
- Manage referral process to special education (including coordinating assessment and scheduling of meetings).
- Collaborate with other Student Support Team members to deliver RtI before sped referral.
- Provide technical and professional development support to general education teachers in inclusive education and supportive techniques for delivering SDI in their classrooms.
- Provide and coordinate accommodations for students testing
- Coordinate with Ops re federal count and other sped-related administrative tasks
